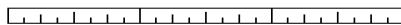

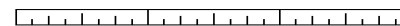

If you haven't been to lodge in a while, please consider coming out again. We would love to have you back in your lodge. So Mote It Be!

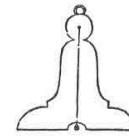
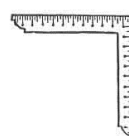

## Monthly Message

The **Sanctum Sanctorum** was the reason Solomon's Temple was built. It was the innermost room of the temple and strictly guarded. It was reached by passing through the gates, through a porch on which stood two pillars and ultimately into the Holy place or middle chamber and then finally to the doors of the inner chamber or "Holy of Holies". Inside these doors was the Ark of the Covenant and was seen as the place that the presence of God dwelt. David ordered the Tabernacle brought to Jerusalem and his heir Solomon built the temple as we are taught. When the temple was completed, the Ark was placed in the Sanctum Sanctorum, and the inner chamber became the dwelling place for the presence of God. To stand in the Sanctum Sanctorum was to stand in God's presence. Today we gather in that room. The three Great lights and the three lesser lights give that room higher meaning. Here we do our work for the benefit of all mankind, and ourselves. Your lodge room honors this temple, and provides a private place for rest and contemplation.
