



#### Thanksgiving Proclamation

In October of 1789 the United States had only emerged from the Revolutionary War by a scant few years. We had newly elected our first President, George Washington (raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in the Lodge at Fredericksburg on August 4th, 1753), and the Congress was busy delivering the fresh-off-the-presses Bill of Rights that had been adopted as the first ten amendments to the new Constitution to the state capitols of the new United States. The Judiciary act of 1789 formed the entire federal judiciary, including the Supreme Court.

However, even in these hectic times of nation building, our first President, Brother George Washington, took the time to remember and acknowledge the debt we as Americans all owe to the Divine in the first Thanksgiving Proclamation:

"Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and Whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me to "recommend to the people of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness:

Now, therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the 26th day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favorable interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty which we have since enjoyed; for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and, in

general, for all the great and various favors which He has been pleased to confer upon us.

And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions; to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness to us), and to bless them with good governments, peace, and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and us; and, generally to grant unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best.

Given under my hand, at the city of New York, the 3d day of October, A.D. 1789."

Please join us as we will soon be conferring the Entered Apprentice Degree. Also, we will be talking about changes to our By-Laws, any input would be appreciated. And now a word from our GM.

This project will go from now until Christmas giving every Delaware Freemason an ample opportunity to participate. If you are a current blood donor, this will be easy and we thank you for your involvement. If you are not currently a blood donor, this gives you a great opportunity to start and see how easy the process is. The basic requirements are you must be between the ages of 17 and 79 years old, weigh at least 110 pounds, be in general good health and meet the minimum eligibility requirements. All donors must provide a photo ID or two other forms of identification, including date of birth.

The Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Delaware is signed up as part of the HERO Program for this drive. That means you only have to take three easy steps to donate:

- Call the Blood Bank of Delmarva at 1-888-8-BLOOD-8 and make an appointment to donate;
- Go to the Blood Bank location to which you signed up to donate on the day and time of your appointment and complete a HERO Card. This care will ask for your name and organization (Grand Lodge of Delaware Freemasons). This will ensure that your donation is tracked for our count)
- Make your blood donation (which only takes about 5 to 7 minutes) and then enjoy free cookies and snacks in the canteen.

This process couldn't be much easier and it is a great way to create positive Masonic inertia in your life and be a shining example for our community. If you have any questions, please contact W.
