

Your job is only completed when you have taught the new brother what he needs to know, including what he needs to know to one day take over your responsibilities.

In short, your job isn't finished until you have trained your replacements, and trained them to recruit and train their replacements...

Masonry has a proud heritage; if you want it to have a bright future you must plan and act accordingly.

Masonry isn't just for the here and now, it is for the future. Happy hunting.
