DID YOU KNOW?

- The first modern Olympic Games were held in the summer in 1896 in Athens, Greece.
- The month of June is named after the Roman goddess Juno.
- Roman general Marc Antony named the month of July after Julius Caesar.
- August was named after Julius Caesar's nephew. He had received the title of "Augustus" which means "revered".
- The "dog days of summer" refer to the dates from July 3rd to August 11th. They are named so after Sirius the Dog Star located in the constellation of Canis Major. The ancient Greeks blamed Sirius for the hot temperatures, drought, discomfort, and sickness that occurred during the summer.
- Before the Civil War, schools did not have summer vacation. In rural communities, kids had school off during the spring planting and fall harvest while urban schools were essentially year-round. The long summer holiday didn't come about until the early 20th century.
- The Eiffel Tower grows in summer. This historic structure is made of iron. Metal expands with heat. As a result, the Eiffel Tower can grow more than 15 centimeters (6 inches) in hot weather.
- Twice a year around May 28 and July 12, New York City is home to a fascinating sunset phenomenon. Owing to the city's design on a grid rotated 29° clockwise from true east-west, the sun sets directly at the end of many of New York's major streets to create a spectacular sunset. The sun is slightly above the horizon and nestled between the rows of buildings.
- People have long believed that Stonehenge was the site of ancient druid solstice celebrations because of the way the sun lines up with the stones on the winter and summer solstices. While there's no proven connection between Celtic solstice celebrations and Stonehenge. These days, thousands of modern pagans gather at the landmark to watch the sunrise on the summer solstice.





