


EUREKA-DUPONT GRAPHIC DESIGN APPAREL

DID YOU KNOW?

- The name of the ninth month of the year September comes from the old Roman word "septem", meaning "seven", because in the Roman calendar it was the seventh month.
- The Romans believed that the month of September was looked after by the god of the fire and forge **Vulcan**. Therefore, they expected fires, earthquakes and volcanic eruptions in this month.
- The autumnal equinox, which is the traditional transition from summer into fall, takes place on or around September 22nd, depending on the year.
- September 6, 1620: The Pilgrims sailed from Plymouth, England, on the Mayflower to settle in North America.
- **September 1, 1752:** "Proclaim LIBERTY throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof." The Liberty Bell arrived in Philadelphia to be placed in the Pennsylvania State House (now Independence Hall).
- **September 5, 1774**: The 1st Continental Congress was called to order. Comprised of delegates from all 13 American colonies, it served as the governing body during the American Revolution, from 1774 to 1789. Two years later, on September 9, it changed the name of the United Colonies to the United States.
- **September 3, 1777:** At Cooch's Bridge, in Newark Delaware, an early skirmish of the American Revolutionary war took place, where the Flag of the United States was flown in battle for the first time.
- **September 22, 1862:** President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, which ended slavery in the territories held by the Confederacy, effective January 1, 1863.
- **September 8, 1892:** The Pledge of Allegiance was first published by the Youth's Companion Magazine "I pledge allegiance to my Flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
- **September 5, 1906:** 1906 The first legal forward pass in American football was thrown by Bradbury Robinson of St. Louis University to teammate Jack Schneider in a 22 0 victory over Carroll College (Wisconsin).
- September 11, 2001: On a Tuesday morning, members of the Islamic terrorist group al-Qaeda hijacked four airliners as part of a series of coordinated attacks against targets in the United States. The Twin Towers in New York City were hit by one plane each, while one plane crashed into the Pentagon in Washington, D.C. The fourth plane is thought to have been headed for the White House, but passengers overtook the hijackers and the plane crashed into a field in rural Pennsylvania. More than 3,000 people lost their lives during what was the deadliest terror attack on U.S. soil to date.
