

Farewell to our Brother, Richard "Dick" D. McDaniel

Richard Delaplaine McDaniel was born July 12, 1925, in Wilmington, Delaware. He grew up in Westover Hills and attended Wilmington Friends School. He joined the Navy shortly after graduating from high school and served until the end of WWII. Following in his father's footsteps, Richard became a Mason and was Entered into the Craft in Eureka Lodge No. 23 in 1949. He and his father, Alexander H. McDaniel, opened McDaniel Yacht Basin in North East, Maryland in 1937, and it inspired his lifelong love of boating. He later became President of First National Bank of North East and worked there until his retirement. Richard's greatest passion was boating and his greatest love was his family. He was happiest when the family was together. Richard passed away peacefully in his home on February 4, 2020, and will forever be missed.
