Lodge will be called to rest, and dinner will be served at 6:30. A delicious meal is anticipated.



Masonic Symbols ...and what they mean

The Masonic gavel has two distinctive meanings. In the Stonemasons era, a gavel was used in shaping stones.



Similarly, in Freemasonry, it serves as a speculative reminder for members to remain morally pure and separate themselves from societal vices.

Masons are viewed as living stones that can be shaped by breaking rough edges to live a life pleasing to our creator.

When used by a Master of a Lodge, the Masonic Gavel is a figure of authority. He uses it to manifest his power in the lodge through his actions. Through this, he can maintain order in proceedings.
