### Masonic Education: Defining Freemasonry

This has resulted in a variety of practices, some of which emphasize *charity* as Freemasonry's primary purpose. While charitable actions are positive, they do not solely define Freemasonry.

The diversity in practice emphasizes the need to preserve the fundamental values of the fraternity, which focus on personal growth and moral development. The teachings of Freemasonry should remain the guiding principles. Thus, members and Lodges must stay true to these foundational teachings and rituals to ensure the essence of Freemasonry is maintained and passed on. By staying committed to this mission, Freemasonry can continue to have a meaningful impact on its members and society.
